WHEREAS Sections 5 and 9 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, provide that the powers of the Municipal Council shall be exercised by By-Law, unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do otherwise and that the municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purposes of exercising its authority;

AND WHEREAS Council enacted By-law 2021-46 on April 20, 2021, which was a duplicate by-law to By-law 2021-45 to authorize the execution of a contract with the firm of Reid & Deleye Contractors Ltd for Request for Tender PW-E-21-45 Port Dover Water Treatment Plant Clarifier Replacement in the amount of \$1,524,938.00 (excluding HST);

The Corporation of Norfolk County By-Law 2021-70

Being a By-Law to Amend By-Law 2011-189, as Amended, to Regulate Parking within Norfolk County. (Schedule "A", On-Street Parking)

WHEREAS Sections 5 and 9 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, provide that the powers of the Municipal Council shall be exercised by by-law, unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do otherwise and that the municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purposes of exercising its authority;

AND WHEREAS Section 27 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, authorizes a municipality to pass by-laws in respect of a highway over which it has jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County deems it necessary to amend By-Law 2011-189, as amended, Schedule 'A' On-Street Parking, to introduce to extend the restricted no parking signs on Oakwood Avenue, Simcoe (Ward 5).

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. THAT Schedule "A" of By-Law 2011-189 be amended through the addition of the entry in Schedule "A" of By-Law 2021-70.
- 2. That the effective date of this By-Law shall be the date of passage.

Please be advised that at the Brantford City Council Meeting held April 27, 2021, the following resolution was adopted:

Request - Province of Ontario withdraws its prohibition on golfing and any other outdoor recreational activities
