# **Information Package Memo**

Re: Norfolk County Soil Remediation Update

This information memo will provide an update to Council on the latest progress of the Norfolk County Soil Remediation Project at 568 Queensway W, Simcoe since the last information memo of April 2020. This Phase 2 was approved by Council in report PW 19-66 in October 2019.

- The pump and treat system operating in the woodlot to the east of the Norfolk County Garage (NCG) has continued to function, with monthly compliance monitoring.
- The installation of the infrastructure to connect the system in the garage to the treatment system in the woodlot was completed during the summer of 2020.
- Ground Water Treatment System 1 is off-line and was demobilized in February 2018, with exception of the dewatering wells along the east side of the Subject Property which were secured and will remain accessible if further treatment is required due to the potential for adverse effects from the NCG short-term and/or long-term ongoing remediation program.
- A second smaller system (System 2) was brought on-line at the end of December 2017 and has continued to operate, with compliance monitoring, water sampling and chemical testing conducted by Peto MacCallum Ltd. (PML). The chemical quality of the discharge water continues to meet the Table 2 Site Condition Standards (SCSs) for PHC Fractions F1 to F4 and Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) in a Potable Ground Water (PGW) condition. System 2 is included as part of System 3.
- System 3 is a larger "pump-and-treat" system that includes infrastructure across the north portion of the NCG (at the source) and downgradient across the wooded lot at 33 Rob Blake Way to seven extraction wells located west of a granular activated carbon (GAC) wall on the west side of 548 Queensway West. Baseline sampling and chemical testing of ground water at select monitoring wells within System 3 was completed in June and July 2020, prior to System 3 commencing. As of the end of October 2020, the System 3 circulation system is working per design expectations. A low dosage of surfactant was injected on October 2020 and is recirculating through the GAC to the beginning of the plume at the NCG. There

is evidence of positive contaminant mobilization as a result of the surfactant injection. Ground water sampling and testing continues on a regular basis. This system will now remain in place for the duration of the project, expected to last two to three years.
